She passed away on September 5, 1997, at the age of 87. The International Day of Charity was first marked by the United Nations General Assembly in 2012.

Since we have a large number of members who

are employed, the day of September 5th would likely fall on a day during the work week in several subsequent years, therefore we have chosen the second Saturday of every September as our Order's Day of Charitable Service. Alternatively, if a members' community has an organized event in the month of September that they could become involved, that day would also be most acceptable.

The charitable service or volunteer work may consist of a variety of things, generally works of service that would best serve each members own community, for a minimum of four hours, if possible.

in a new direction. After ministering at his church for 10 years, in August he will begin teaching at a Christian school. In the months prior to that, he will be very busy



FROM THE DESK OF OUR GC









raduation season is upon us. Maybe you'll be attending a graduation ceremony for a child or grandchild, niece or nephew and if it's at a Christian school or college you might hear the speaker share Jeremiah 29:11, "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope." We have cherrypicked this verse to say that God has a plan for all of us, when the original purpose behind this verse was God talking to the nation of Israel. But, I think there is still wisdom in this verse and I do believe that God has a plan for each and every one of us. God has placed a call on each one of our lives.

In a general sense God has given us the Great Commission, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." [Matthew 28: 19-20] This is the same call for every believer. While secular knights wore hose to show off their shapely calves, fashionably pointed shoes and short tunics, the Templars were not allowed to wear hose of any kind, nor pointed shoes, and their habits were longer than the popular short tunics worn by other knights; short enough to allow maneuverability, but not so short as to be immodest.

CHAIN OF COMMAND

ince the Order maintains a military structure, chain of command is important. Maintaining chain of command discipline helps to cultivate an atmosphere of respect and a better flow of communication. The chain of command is:

- All Priory members; CAAs, members with rank, and Priory officers report/communicate directly to their Priory leader.
- Priory leaders report/communicate directly to the Grand Prior.
- Grand officers report/communicate directly to the Grand Prior.
- Grand Prior reports/communicates directly to the Grand Master.

DISSEMINATION AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF INFORMATION

When information or a directive is given by a Priory leader, the Grand Prior, or the Grand Master via a post made on Belief Book or in a chat session, the response of "Read and Understood" is common protocol that shows acknowledgment that it has been read and understood. This conduct is for all Order members. If a Priory leader shares information or a directive to his Priory members, they should respond with "Read and Understood". If the Grand Prior or the Grand Master shares information or a directive, all members should respond with "Read and Understood".

This simply shows respect for the chain of command and indicates to the person who is sharing the information or directive that it has been read and is understood. If a member does not understand the information or the directive, then the member should make contact through their chain of command to make an inquiry for further explanation.

PRIORY OFFICER POSITIONS

s with the United States Grand Priory, each Priory may have members that fill certain officer positions. In order to assume a Priory officer position, a member must be knighted. Officer positions are filled solely* at the discretion of the Prior or Master Commander of the Priory. It is not necessary that every officer position be filled.

When a member is a Priory officer, that officer title takes precedence over their rank within the Priory. For example, if Knight Captain John Doe is also the Priory Seneschal, he is referred to as Seneschal John. Officer positions can be, but are not limited to:

Seneschal - Second in rank in the Priory. Monitors and evaluates operations in the Priory and reports to the Prior or Master Commander. Takes over leadership when the Prior or Master Commander is absent.

Marshal - Third in rank in the Priory. Focuses on personnel, maintains Priory records, oversees training and encourages participation.

Turcopolier - Fourth in rank in the Priory. Focuses on protocol and military etiquette by keeping all Priory members in line with Templar guidelines.

Almoner- Organizes fundraisers or charity events and may act as the Priory Treasurer.

Chaplain - Provides the spiritual welfare of the Priory. May field prayer requests or conduct Priory Bible studies. *Before a Priory Chaplain is appointed, vetting must been done by the Grand Priory's Grand Chaplain.
