FROM THE DESK OF OUR GC

n 1065, the advocate for the Pope travelled to Constantinople to the great church Hagia Sophia, which, at that time was the Holy Seat of the Ecumenical Patriarch for the Orthodox Church. The advocate came into the church during the Divine Liturgy and threw upon the Holy Altar a Bull written by the Pope to excommunicate the Patriarch of Constantinople because the Patriarch wanted to continue the tradition which had been followed since the formation of the Church, which was that all bishops are equal. The Patriarch wrote a similar edict to excommunicate the Pope. Thereby breaking apart The One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church into what would become known as The Orthodox Church in the East and the Roman Catholic Church in the West. The word "catholic" here meaning 'complete and universal.' The Bishops of the church had already started playing politics by the 8th century, when the Roman Pontiff started exerting his agreed upon place of 'first among equals' by pushing that he alone was the leader of Christ's church upon the earth. The Patriarchate Churches of Antioch, Alexandria, Constantinople and Jerusalem did not agree with him.

When we delve into the earliest roots of our noble Order, we see that their first vows were to the Patriarch of Jerusalem. This means they took their first vows to what had become by that time what is known today as The Orthodox Church. Later after King Baldwin of Jerusalem gave them their permanent headquarters inside the Royal Chamber of what was believed to be the ancient site of the Temple of Solomon, Hugh de Payen went with four brothers to Rome to ask the Pope to recognize them as a Holy Order. This means the knights were then recognized by both the Orthodox Church and the Roman Catholic Church. The first ecumenical act of any Christians that we know of.

Jerusalem is the place on earth He chose to ascend to Heaven to go to the Father so our salvation would be completed. A small town in a small country, yet the most Holy physical place on earth. Let us carry Jerusalem in our hearts. Let us pray for the peace of Jerusalem every day as we go into battle and may the enemy quake in fear, for we carry Jesus with us and we are in Him. Our ancient brothers knew this and by this sign they conquered.



Every new Templar was required to meet certain simple requirements: he should be of legitimate birth, free of debt, fit to fight, and unmarried. The Rule's insistence on chastity was so strict that Templars were not even

permitted to kiss their female relatives. Some married men joined briefly, but they did not undergo monastic training. However, their wives did not accompany them and since the Rule insisted on chastity, to prevent any bad influence, their sleeping quarters were kept separate from the permanent, celibate Templars.

Order Certificates

All OMSDT members will eventually receive some sort of certificate that commemorates an achievement during their OMSDT Templar journey; either a Templar Academie class completion certificate or a certificate that reflects a promotion in rank.

Our Order certificates are not mass produced at a print shop. They were designed with much care and thoughtfulness, a collaborative effort between GP Derek Nordio and GSY Reneé Nordio, receiving the approval of GM Rick Trujillo. It is with this same care and thoughtfulness, along with being proud of the receiving member, that they are printed in the Nordio office and mailed out to members.

The CAA class completion certificate is created with a brown flourish graphic that represents the mantle/cloak color that a Companion-at-Arms would wear. Since Sergeants wore a black mantle/cloak, the SAA class completion certificate is created with a black flourish graphic. Acadamie certificates are printed on white heavy cardstock with the Templar Academie logo featured in the lower left of the certificate.


Rank promotion certificates were also carefully and purposely designed with the appropriate wording for each rank. These certificates feature a wax seal in the lower right with black and white ribbon decorating the upper left corner of the certificate and are printed on parchment-colored heavy cardstock.

All certificates are mailed in a sturdy "DO NOT BEND" envelope. It is our genuine hope that the certificates arrive to members in the same condition as when they leave the Nordio office, would be considered worthy of framing, and a sense of pride would resonate in the member when they open the envelope to reveal the contents.

On the next four pages are photographs that share the process (and love) that goes into producing the certificates for OMSDT members.

The first certificate a member receives is from the CAA class completion, and features the corner flourishes in a light shade of brown.



Once a member for six months, and with the completion of the SAA classes, a certificate that features the corner flourishes in black is awarded.


For the rank certificates, the first step is for GSY to personalize the template design in her computer program by inserting the member's name, rank, print it on the parchment-colored cardstock, and add the ribbon embellishment.



The next step is for GP to begin the process of creating the wax seal; first by taking the small wax cubes and melting them using a small votive candle that rests below a plate with a hole cut in it that holds a measuring reservoir with handle.



After melting the wax, he pours it into a mold sheet and carefully presses the metal seal into the wax. It took a few tries for GP to figure out the correct amount of time the seal should sit in the wax in order to gently remove it to create a clear impression.

"Mistakes" were easily melted to try again. Persistence and patience yielded reward!

You can see the wax cubes in the jar at the bottom of the photo.





After the seal has cooled, it is gently removed from the mold, and it's then time to affix it to the certificate. Round, double-sided 'stickies' are applied to the backside of the wax seal and the protective paper cover is removed, then GP carefully affixes the seal to the certificate.

The certificate is then handed back to GSY for mailing. First, back to the graphics program to create a specialized mailing label for the recipient.

The photo at left shows four mailings being prepared; heavy-duty mailing envelopes, recipient address labels, return address labels and postage.




The final step; ready for mailing. This is what you can expect to receive in the mail. On the back of the envelope is a tab to pull for easy opening, in hopes that your certificate arrives in good condition.

GP and GSY always take great pleasure when given the chance to mail these out to members.
