

The Priories of St. Luke, Holy Trinity, St. Joan of Arc and St. Michael the Archangel enjoyed having at least one member receive their Accolade.



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FROM THE DESK OF OUR GC

Grand Chaplain (Fr. John) Kelmy Rodriquez

During the New Year, millions will partake in New Year's resolutions. Some resolutions are trivial; others are major turning points that may result in failure and disappointment. The majority will break their declarations before the end of the new month. This is expected and understandable. We become accustomed to specific situations and behaviors and are unable to change. However, we must find a way to strive to succeed in our pending undertakings if we wish victory. A heart may want to accomplish tentative goals, however, a confident mindset is required for optimal results in transformation.

Everything Is A Process

I believe that denominationalism and opinions can become complicated, especially when you begin your new walk with God. Depending on the avenue of faith, which you are free to follow, many Elders, Pastors, and Ministers have expectations and time frames regarding your spiritual growth.
